### **CEO'S REPORT by Peter Ali**

### **FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION MANAGER'S REPORT by Oliver Bott**

#### **TAB TURNOVER & DISTRIBUTIONS – ON & OFF COURSE**

At the March 2009 Board meeting, a presentation was provided to Directors in relation to the structure of the method of distribution of TAB wagering revenue (both on and off-course).

For readers and participants' information, the following summary provides an overview of how Greyhound Racing SA generates revenue from these sources –

#### **Off-course turnover**

UNITAB, based in Queensland, purchased the SA TAB in 2001, and is the wagering provider licensed to operate in South Australia.

Off-course wagering is generated through TAB agencies, PubTAB's, telephone and internet sources, but **does not include wagering conducted on course at registered racetracks, where an approved totalisator is in operation.**

Distributions are allocated to the Racing Industry in accordance with the Racing Distribution Agreement (RDA), between UNITAB and the three racing codes. The Agreement specifies that the racing industry receives 39% of net wagering revenue (NWR). Net wagering revenue is effectively commission received on wagering, or in other words, turnover less winning bets paid out. Different bet types return varying rates of commission, but over the total spread of wagering, the consolidated NWR rate of return is approximately 15.8%.

The Inter Code Agreement was formulated at the time the SA TAB was sold to UNITAB. This Agreement provides that distributions of NWR to each code for any financial year is determined by average market share as at 30 June immediately preceding the year of allocation. In other words, average market share for each code takes into account the turnover generated by each code for a full financial year (1 July to 30 June), and that percentage is then applied for the entirety of the following year, and so on.

Average market share means the sum of local (SA) market share plus the national (Australia wide **including SA**) market share divided by 2. An example may better illustrate the point –

Let's say for a financial year ending 30 June 20xx, the total off-course TAB turnover in SA was \$500 million. Of this turnover, \$80 million was wagered on greyhound racing meetings across Australia.

Therefore, the national market share for greyhounds is  $80/500 \times 100 = 16.00\%$ .

Furthermore, during this year, of the \$500 million wagered in total, \$100 million was wagered on thoroughbred, harness and greyhound meetings held in South Australia alone. The amount wagered on SA greyhound meetings was \$12 million.

Therefore, the local market share for greyhounds is  $12/100 \times 100 = 12.00\%$ .

To calculate **average market share** for greyhounds, it is quite simply –

National (16%) plus Local (12%) divided by 2, or  $(16 + 12)/2 = \mathbf{14.00\%}$

That means that for the next entire financial year, greyhounds will receive 14% of net wagering revenue generated by the TAB, regardless of weekly fluctuations in turnover and market share for each code as a result of uplifts or downturns with track closures, loss of meetings or boom periods as a result of national carnivals (ie. Spring Racing Carnival with thoroughbreds, Inter Dominion with harness or National Championships with greyhounds).

As local (SA) turnover comprises approximately 12% of national greyhound turnover, clearly we are dependant on UNITAB covering as many interstate greyhound meetings as possible.

For the year ended 30 June 2008, greyhounds achieved an average market share of 16.404%. Therefore, for this current financial year (2008/2009), greyhounds receive 16.404% of NWR generated by the TAB on a monthly basis, in arrears. This share was somewhat inflated by the outbreak of Equine Influenza during the 2007/2008 year, when the horse codes suffered through loss of racing product.

As a more accurate comparison, for the preceding five years, the average greyhound market share averaged 14.11%.

While on average market share, you will notice that in recent years, GRSA has concentrated marketing towards wagering on code AG, or SA greyhounds. Because average market share is weighted by both local and national turnover, any uplift in local turnover is included in the national turnover as well, resulting in a “double effect” increase in the average market share. Therefore, the push to wager on code AG, as well as programming more Sky/TAB meetings in South Australia, further contributes to greyhound racing NWR. As a rule of thumb, every 1% increase in average market share equates to approximately \$450,000 additional net wagering revenue to the greyhound code, based on current turnover levels.

Prior to the start of the 2008/2009 financial year, the SA Government announced tax relief benefits to the racing industry, as a result of recommendations arising out of the Bentley report. The Government had been collecting taxation at the rate of 6% of NWR. The taxation reform proposed that this rate of taxation be removed over a period of five years, commencing 1 July 2008. Relief for the first year amounted to 3% of NWR, progressively reducing to zero by 2012/2013. This in effect means that the SA racing industry will be paid 45% of NWR by that time.

On the question of clawback, this commitment to the SA Government has not changed. The racing industry will continue to pay the Government \$3.03 million per year, until 2015/2016, which emanated from the sale of the SA TAB. The amount paid by each code every year is also determined by average market share. For example, if the greyhound code's average market share was 14%, then GRSA incurs \$424,200 as its share of clawback. Under arrangements between the SA Government and UNITAB, 1/12<sup>th</sup> of this amount is deducted directly from the monthly Product Fee payable to our code.

### **On-course turnover**

On-course totalisator wagering at greyhound race meetings is also conducted by UNITAB, who act as agents for the licensee, namely the club conducting the meeting. In South Australia, on-course totalisators are conducted at meetings held at Angle Park, Gawler, and selected Port Pirie and Strathalbyn greyhound meetings.

Turnover generated by the on-course tote is linked to the off-course UNITAB pools, but **does not form part of the turnover used to calculate average market share associated with the Inter Code Agreement.**

Instead, the NWR generated from on-course wagering is credited directly to the club conducting the meeting, less operating expenses. These expenses include wages paid to UNITAB staff, a UNITAB management fee, cash handling fees and computer terminal maintenance costs. As these costs are fixed, a minimum level of turnover is required to generate sufficient NWR in order to meet these costs. As on-course tote turnover increases thereafter, so does the income returned to the club.

In the 2007/2008 financial year Angle Park and Gawler meetings generated approximately \$277,000 in revenue for GRSA. Port Pirie and Strathalbyn's on-course tote operations also assisted their clubs in securing additional revenue, in order to meet operating expenses.

### **Summary**

As identified in the GRSA Strategic Plan, the objective is to increase the number of SA greyhound meetings covered by Sky Channel. This results in UNITAB providing both off-course wagering and on-course totalisator services, emphasizing the important relationship between Sky coverage and TAB wagering.

Quite clearly, over the past ten years, technological advances in wagering options available to off-course punters has resulted in diminishing on-course tote revenue.

Therefore, the challenge facing GRSA and our country clubs is to make attending race meetings more appealing, from both an entertainment and wagering perspective.

In 2007/2008, the TAB Product Fee and on-course tote income accounted for over 80% of GRSA's total income. While alternative income streams are continually being sourced and improved upon, wagering on greyhounds still remains core to our business.

## **OPERATION MANAGER'S REPORT** *by Peter Smith*

### **PREMIER'S CUP**

Risk It returns to Angle Park tonight, looking for a win in our feature race on the program. He will be looking to take out the \$6,000 Premier's Cup, following on from his recent strong placings in the Galaxy Series at Cannington in Perth. He has drawn wide in box eight, but he does usually get back in his races, so this may not be too big a disadvantage. His main rivals appear to be veteran Token Ned, Le Grand Bale and recent 731m winners in Kimberley Jinx and Stevie McLaren. Sparkling Spear has also been placed at his last three distance starts and must come into calculations. However if he runs up to his best form, it is hard to see Risk It being beaten.

GRSA will be entertaining a number of our parliamentary members tonight including the Minister for Racing Hon. Michael Wright, who will be presenting the trophy on behalf of the Premier.

### **GOLDEN EASTER EGG SEMI-FINALS**

There was quite a deal of discussion this week regarding Drink Driver being made a reserve in the Golden Easter Egg Heats at Wentworth Park last week. It was a situation where under the NSW Grading system, they weren't left with many options, based on the race conditions. The Club has advised that they will review the conditions for future events.

Nevertheless, we have four great Semi-Finals of "The Egg" this Saturday night. El Galo looks to have a mortgage on the series after a brilliant heat win and drawing box one in his semi. The Sky Channel Adelaide Cup winner recorded the fastest heat of 29.83 and had most trainers thinking about second prizemoney for the final. Miss Elly Mint, which has won twenty of her last twenty-one starts is probably the biggest danger. She has spent most of her career in NSW and she will have the home track advantage. She is drawn to meet Cool Flight, which has drawn box won in the second semi. Trew Millions and Mantra Lad are also drawn into the same semi-final. Size Can Matter looks a good chance to get through after drawing the red in the third semi.

Local punters will be able to watch all the action on Sky Channel and the SA TAB will also have full coverage of all races. The Easter Egg Semis will be races three to six, with the first timed to jump at 7.37pm. El Galo is in race six at 8.37pm.

### **GOTBA COURSING SUNDAY**

The GOTBA Coursing season at Virginia begins this Sunday (April 5<sup>th</sup>). The Club will race on Sunday and then again on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> April. These meetings are additional dates added to the race calendar to help partly offset the lost straight track dates. The Club has received 52 for this Sunday's meeting.

The coursing season will run through to October, with the Waterloo Cup to be run in September.

### **MOUNT GAMBIER CUP FINAL**

Good luck to the Mount Gambier Club this Saturday (April 4<sup>th</sup>), with the running of the 2009 South Aussie Hotel Mount Gambier Cup Final. Following six heats last Saturday, the Club has a strong field for this weeks \$3,000 Final. Once again they have a strong supporting program, with The \$1,000 Produce Store Maiden Final; the \$1,000 Wandillo Pet Foods Trackside Meats Distance Feature; and The Barry's Door Services Super Sprint Feature the main races on a ten race program.

### **BREEDERS 2009 PRELUDE (2) SERIES**

Yesterday (Wednesday) saw three heats of the second Prelude Series for Breeders 2008. The results from the heats were:

Heat 1 – Moonlight Miss (30.44)

Heat 2 - Gold (30.49)

Heat 3 – Manhattan Angel (30.15)

As we had one less heat than our latest estimate, it meant that the races in this Prelude had higher prizemoney than the first Prelude. The heats were worth \$1,200, which included \$200 to the breeder of the winner. While the Prelude (2) Final will carry a total of \$3,700, which will include \$500 to the breeder of the winner. The Breeders 2009 Prelude (2) Final will be run next Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> April.

Breeders 2009 will culminate with the Breeders Plate Final to be run on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> April. If we have four heats for the Breeders Plate, then prizemoney for the three race series will be: Heats - \$1,400 (Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> April); Semis- \$3,900 (Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> May); Final - \$29,000 (Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> May). Once final numbers are known, we will confirm the prizemoney.

### **ANGLE PARK TRACK TURNOVER/GRILLE CHANGE**

At this stage the weather looks alright for Friday, so we are going ahead with the Angle Park track turnover tomorrow (Friday). Saturday morning trials are cancelled on the 4<sup>th</sup> April as a result.

We are having the changes to the 600m starting box grille as advised last week completed tomorrow.

### **GRADING AND ORDER CHANGES**

Angle Park's new Monday night Grade, APM, begins next Monday night. As advised over recent week's there are some changes to the Grading Guidelines and the Orders of Preference as a result of this.

## **NEW BREEDER REGISTRATIONS**

We have commended introduction of a Breeders Registration. The previously advertised fee of \$25.00 annually has been introduced. The handling of the applications is using the following procedure

Any person who has bred a litter within the last 3 years and currently holds a Public Trainer or Owner/Trainers licence will be granted automatically a "Breeders Licence" on application.

Any other person who has bred a litter within the 3 year time frame will be issued a licence at the discretion of stewards. This is required, to ensure that all litters are whelped in kennels that meet the current "Code of Practice".

Any other application will be treated as a "New Application". New applicants will be required to meet the following requirements, which are similar to anyone applying for a new trainers licence.

- 1 Application to be lodged on the prescribed form with the appropriate fee.
- 2 The application shall be accompanied with a current police clearance.
- 3 The application will be accompanied by three letters of reference, with two coming from industry participants
- 4 The applicant will undertake a Breeders Application Education package and Questionnaire
- 5 The applicant will undertake an interview before a selected panel of industry participants to ascertain the credentials and motives of the applicant. Breeders Task Force Members will assist with this process.
